What can Nurture do for my child?

Our Nurture class can specifically support the social and emotional development of your child whilst continuing the Early Years curriculum. We focus upon emotions, language and communication to help your child access their learning confidently and happily. Our days include high levels of supported social play, additional circle times, PATHs sessions and social stories. Our daily toast time provides extra opportunities to practise turn taking, sharing, following instructions and talking together in a relaxed way. The classroom is arranged to form a warm and homely space where the children feel relaxed, accepted and safe. Spaces are present to promote calming, self-soothing and sensory support.
